On behalf of the Naamghar Association of America (NAAM), I am very pleased to welcome you all to our Streaming-as well as a -Live Guru-Axon Consecration Ceremony.

Our Naamghar *Thapona* was established in 2016 by the *Satradhikar* Dr. Sri Sri Pitambar Deva Goswami of the Auniati Xattra, one of the oldest and largest monasteries in Majuli, Assam. It was the maiden visit of a *Satradhikar* to America. Its *Guru Áxon* was then duly consecrated by Dr. Goswami in his second visit in 2017. (The book of Dr Pitambar Deva Goswami – “*Amerikar Aam Ronga Rang*” was displayed at the event).

NAAM is a not-for-profit trust that was granted 501(c)(3) status in 2018. We are an organization for the Assamese diaspora to celebrate the spiritual traditions and the philosophical teachings of the great Neo-Vaishnavite Saint Srimanta Sankardeva.

Through NAAM, we offer you a forum to express and experience these rich traditions propagated by Srimanta Sankardeva, including but not limited to regular devotional *Naam-Praxangas*, *Borgeet*, and various performing arts, for example, *Xatriya* dance, *Bhaona* and many more at our annual events.

We had a 1-minute silent prayer in honor of the late Kedar Bhuyan, followed by a prayer song, and proceeded with our consecration ceremony at our temporary Community Naamghar premises at 1600 Washington Valley Road, Martinsville, NJ 08836.



CONCEPT REPORT ON THE PROPOSED 'SANKARADEVA CULTURAL CENTER AND NAAMGHAR' IN NEW-JERSEY, USA

The proposed '**Sankaradeva Cultural Center and Naamghar**' in New-Jersey, USA, is an ambitious conceptual project envisioned on approximately 3 acres of land. This conceptually proposed complex aims to serve as a vibrant cultural and spiritual hub that preserves Assamese heritage while embracing for the broader community activities.

In addition to its cultural and social significance, the project emphasizes financial sustainability to ensure smooth operations and long-term maintenance. The inclusion of a banquet hall for weddings, festivals and social events along with a dining hall supported by a well-equipped kitchen, will create avenues for revenue generation.

The performing art hall may be used for Arts and varied exhibitions and workshops, further contributing to financial stability. A dedicated guest house will provide accommodation for visitors, artists and scholars to sustain the complex's upkeep and day to day expenses, while the library and administrative office will support educational and community activities.

Given the present fund constraints, the project is planned to be executed in a phased manner to ensure steady progress without compromising its core vision. As part of this approach, the

dining area and performing arts hall may be integrated with the banquet hall to optimize space and resources during the initial phase. This flexible design strategy will allow the complex to function efficiently from the outset while enabling future expansions as additional funds become available.

By balancing cultural aspirations with practical execution, the '**Sankaradeva Cultural Center and Naamghar**' aspires to be a self-reliant institution that continues to serve the Assamese community for generations to come.


NAAM is very pleased to share some preliminary architectural designs created by renowned architect firm DESIGN PLENUM from Guwahati, India, in the next two pages.

Jersey,USA.**



- **Common Yearly Ones: ~\$80K**

- Regular yearly fund raising event
 - Dinner with celebrities - \$10K
 - Cultural functions - \$10K
 - Other (like in Sankardev Tithis) - \$10K
- Plaque placement for love ones (say 50 plaques/150) ~ \$7.5K
- Selling Sankardev Literatures : \$5K

Dear Well-Wishers of NAAM,

We sincerely appreciate all our supporters for their continued encouragement and their monetary donations. With your support, we were able to open a temporary Naamghar in Martinsville, NJ.

We thank all those who participated in the donation of silver flowers for the Guru-Axon. Any well-wishers who want to still participate in this process, please go to our website (www.naamghar.org) and make a donation of \$20 per silver-flower.

We need donors who can contribute towards the rent we pay for the temporary space we are renting for Naamghar. Every month we need ten families to contribute \$50 each to cover the cost. We have several community members who have come forward to do so but we need more. To participate, please send an email to naaminfo@naamghar.org. Your help will be highly appreciated.

Meanwhile, let us not lose sight of our main objective of building our Naamghar. In the accompanying Table 1 below shows our progress over the years. In 2025, the year-over-year growth in funds available was a little over 10%. This rate of growth was well below the year-over-year growth in 2024 when it was a little over 20%.

We need broader community participation to make progress. We also must keep in mind that our capital requirements for land and building have not been adjusted to account for inflation, so our actual requirements may be

higher than those indicated in the chart once we factor in inflation.

The accompanying data in the next few pages show that a few individual donors account for most of the funds collected. We humbly urge more donors to step up to make this project a reality within a reasonable timeframe.

We are encouraged by and very grateful to some generous donations from individuals who are located far from where the proposed first Naamghar is expected to be located. We hope others in the greater Assamese diaspora will step up with their contributions to achieve the community's desire to establish a Naamghar in North America (NAAM's contact information is given below).

We would like to thank those of you who have purchased the book "Naamghar in America". The donations from the purchase of the book has generated \$1,145 so far. A new English version of the book will be available soon along with the translated versions in Assamese and Tamil. Please continue to show your support by purchasing it yourself or encouraging your friends and family to buy any of the new editions.

KaviKrishna Donates Muga Fabric to Guru-Ashana¹ at Naam Ghar in New Jersey, Linking Ancient Culture with Social Rehabilitation

On November 1st and 15th, 2025, a historic cultural and spiritual milestone was reached within the North American Assamese community. During the establishment of the new Naam Ghar at Martinsville, New Jersey, the KaviKrishna Centre for Indian Knowledge Systems (IKS) performed a sacred offering of traditional Muga fabric to the Guru-Ashana. This gesture served as a profound bridge between the ancient heritage of Kamrupa and the growing Assamese diaspora in the United States, marking a decade of KaviKrishna's mission to preserve and propagate the "Golden Silk" of Assam.

The historical significance of this offering is rooted in antiquity. Muga silk originated in ancient Kamrupa, a fact documented by Kautilya in the *Arthashastra*, where it was praised as *Suvarnakudyaka* (1).

Since ancient times, this unique fabric has been reserved for the most significant cultural and religious functions (1,2,4). Today, this legacy is kept alive in Sualkuchi, Assam—rightfully known as the "Silk Village"—where the art of weaving Muga has been perfected over generations (3). Seeking to revive the spiritual sanctity of the cloth, KaviKrishna has established a modern ritual of donating Muga fabric to prestigious temples and Satras across India and internationally, reaching as far as Vietnam (4).

The ceremony in Martinsville, New Jersey was led by KaviKrishna Founder Director Dr. Bikul Das and CEO Dr. Lekhika Pathak, in the presence of NAAM members and esteemed guests including Shri Dilip Saikia (Member of Parliament and National General Secretary of BJP) and Shri Jayanta Basumatary (Member of Parliament).

The spiritual atmosphere there was enriched by the traditional sounds of Assam. Hon. MP Dilip Saikia joined Dr. Bikul Das in soul-stirring Kirtan chanting, while Dr. Lekhika Pathak performed a moving rendition of Borgeet. Their presence underscored the importance of maintaining cultural roots through the devotional legacy of Srimanta Sankardeva and SriSri Madhavdeva, even thousands of miles from the Brahmaputra valley.

A deeply moving aspect of this specific offering is the humanitarian story behind the loom. Dr. Lekhika Pathak shared with the congregation that the Muga fabric was hand-woven at the KaviKrishna Living Muga Museum in Sualkuchi by cancer patients and their families participating in KaviKrishna's Cancer Patient Rehabilitation Program. For over a decade, the organization has utilized the production of Muga silk as a form of therapeutic vocational support, providing dignity and healing to those battling illness.

KaviKrishna reinforced the timeless connection between Indian Knowledge Systems, ancient Kamrupi heritage, and the compassionate spirit of modern social service by bringing the "Golden Silk" to the Guru Ashana in New Jersey.
